Inspired by a rich history, a vibrant current ministry, and a vision for new and exciting possibilities, an initiative is underway to sustainably fund Presbyterian (USA) ministry to the campus of Davidson College.

An invitation into the life of the Church

Davidson College Statement of Purpose

For many students, college is a formative time for exploring novel ideas in the classroom, considering vocational opportunities, and making crucial decisions about their values. Offering opportunities to consider and renew their faith is critical to the development of the whole person. Davidson College Presbyterian Church (DCPC), through its UKirk campus ministry program, invites Davidson students into the life of the Presbyterian Church and encourages them to explore, develop and deepen their relationship with God.

DCPC is a faithful and engaged PC(USA) congregation located on the campus of Davidson College, an institution rooted in the Reformed Tradition with a distinguished history of cultivating clergy and lay leaders. With support from a loving congregation, Presbyterian campus ministry at Davidson is led by a DCPC associate pastor who provides pastoral care, inspiration, leadership development, support with vocational discernment, and connections between spirituality and community.

Uniquely positioned

DCPC Statement of Purpose

Davidson UKirk is the only PC(USA) affiliated ministry offered to Davidson students. It is distinctive as an inclusive, welcoming community of faith with theologically sophisticated programing and deep connections to a multigenerational congregation.

Many alumni will remember when the Davidson College Chaplain ministered directly to Presbyterian students on campus. The Chaplain is now responsible for addressing the breadth of student spiritual interests. Davidson UKirk is one of sixteen different student religious groups supported by the Chaplain's Office, most of which draw funding from sources outside the College.

Answering a call

DCPC's campus ministry position has grown from being a part-time, sometimes shared position, to a full-time post led by an ordained minister. With assistance from short term grants, campus ministry has flourished, but a more sustainable funding model is needed.

As we imagine a ministry that is well resourced and forward looking, DCPC and Davidson College alumni and friends are coming together to ensure durable funding for a full-time, ordained Associate Pastor for Campus Ministry position. The goal of this shared venture is a \$1.5 million endowment which will supplement the church's contributions through its annual budget. The DCPC Session has specified campus ministry as a mission component of its current Opening Doors capital campaign, with a target of \$750,000 towards the endowment goal. Alumni leaders and committed friends are conducting a parallel campaign to raise a matching \$750,000.

If not here and now, then where and when?
