Jhan and Ian Vellenga recently joined CEPAD's team as Mission Co-Workers through the PCUSA (Presbyterian Church USA). Jhan and Ian work to connect churches in the US with CEPAD's work and develop these relationships.

Scott and Elmarie Parker Middle East

Elmarie Parker serves as regional liaison to Iraq, Syria and Lebanon. She helps strengthen the relational ties and facilitates PCUSA support for programs and activities. Scott serves with the Middle East Council of churches as a writer. He also leads MECC efforts to help children traumatized by war in Iraq and Syria who now seek refuge in Lebanon to develop resiliency.

Tracey King-Ortega Nicaragua

Through this program, she works with PC (USA) delegations to foster partnerships with our Peruvian covenant partners, the Evangelical Church of Peru (IEP) and the Joining Hands Peru Network.

Partnerships **Sigona Presbyterian Church** Kikuyu, Kenya

Our Kenyan partnership, in its **21st** year, has made continued impact via the school program that we support through a collaboration with Sigona Presbyterian Church in Kikuyu, Kenya.

Kids (age 3 -12) attend the day school at the church where families "pay what they can," and our support has helped

stabilize income streams in a very rocky economy. Through monthly zoom calls, prayers and financial support, we have helped them navigate school budget planning, hire new and qualified teaching staff, purchase equipment and curriculum, and prepare for the future.



We are working with our Sigona Presbyterian partners as they prepare for the construction of a new kitchen, dining area, and new classrooms that can be used for both weekday and Sunday

2022 marked the **20th anniversary** of our partnership with Sigona. Dozens DCPC members have visited Kenya, and we have hosted several delegations from Kenya here at DCPC.

We support Global Offerings of the Presbyterian Church

The Global Mission Committee coordinates four special denominational offerings each year. These offerings play an important role in what it means to be a connectional church in the twenty-first century.

These offerings give us opportunities for partnerships based on shared concerns. Our support combines with that of fellow PCUSA churches to make a larger impact.

The four offerings are:

One Great Hour of Sharing

(Easter)

Supports the Presbyterian Disaster Fund, the Presbyterian Hunger Fund and the Self-Development of People

Pentecost Offering

(Pentecost)

Supports Young Adult Volunteers, Ministries for Youth and Children at Risk. DCPC retaining 40% of the offering for local mission

Peace and Global Witness

(World Communion Sunday in October) Supports the Peace of Christ at the local, national and world level

Joy Offering

(Christmas)

Supports the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions and Racial Ethnic Leadership Development

CEPAD ministers to the communities of Nicaragua through development work. Through their partnerships they help communities and individuals come together to support one another to achieve their goals and dreams through sustainable development practices.







Program Partners Jubilee House Ciudad Sandino, Nicaragua

Jubilee House Community houses the Center for Development in Central America.

Their goal is to work in partnership with communities and cooperatives to facilitate empowerment: enabling people

to find their own solutions to the problems they identify and helping connect them with resources to solve their problems.

Partnerships **Kilambe Community** Nicaragua



Our partnership with the people of Nicaragua's Kilambe region continues to be impactful. Over the past 18 years, DCPC has sent DCPC teams to visit our partners in eight villages located in the mountain region of northern Nicaragua.

Our ongoing financial support continues to help in a variety of ways—from hurricane relief and rebuilding, to school supplies, food supplements, uniforms, and scholarships for village students.

In **June 2023**, a team of DCPC delegates will return to Nicaragua to visit our partners after a five year hiatus due to the pandemic.

Refugee Support

In addition to supporting our global brothers & sisters in other parts of the world, we also have found a need in our local community for displaced refugees.

Afghan Family Support

Since the Afghan government collapsed in 2021, DCPC has been working with local Afghan families who have relocated to the Davidson community.



Program Partners Nepal Orphan's Home & Papa's House Nepal

Papa's House serves the poor children of Dhapasi, Nepal through four homes and provides community support through various programs for children and adults.





Program Partners Access 2 Success Nigeria

A2S provides sustainable programs that generate positive change for Nigerian children and their communities.





Ukrainian Support

DCPC provides support and works with displaced Ukrainians who are in the US temporarily due to the war in Ukraine.

N.E.S.T. is an inter-confessional Protestant Seminary serving the evangelical churches of the Middle East.
